Short visit in Loughborough University

From 11th October 2013 to 26th November 2013, as a Ph.D student, I visited Loughborough University.

This is the second time for me to visit another university outside Japan. To be honest, before I went there, I knew that Loughborough University is famous for its sports, not only for the sports facilities but also for the famous athletes that graduated from Loughborough. Such as Steve Backley, Robbie Brightwell, and John Cooper.

He told me that psychology is very important during teaching, sometimes, you need to arrange tasks from difficult to easy; sometimes, just reverse. While, when difficult tasks are needed depends on the psychological changes of the students.

Besides the lectures, Dr. Guillaume Bodet and I have several meetings to discuss about my Ph.D dissertation. He taught me how to conduct an Exploratory Factor Analysis and how to purify the scale step by step. As a teacher, he is really learned and patient. I really appreciate his help with my data analysis and valuable suggestions on my dissertation.

Further, during my short visit, I have several opportunities to communicate with other professors, Ph.D students in Loughborough University. From them, I know what kinds of researches they are doing, and why
